

SUPERMARKETS & STORES GET BEHIND JEREMY'S GREEN SPACES CAMPAIGN

In Jeremy's Green Spaces survey last year, **1,800 people** supported his request for local supermarkets to increase recycling for single use plastics.

So Jeremy contacted local supermarkets to ask them what they were doing. **This is what they said:**

WAITROSE

has removed the option to pack groceries in plastic bags and state they 'are committed to eliminating unnecessary single-use plastics across its (our) business and where possible, only use packaging that can be reused, recycled or composted at home.'

'The waste we collect in our store bins is returned to the warehouse, separated and processed for recycling where possible, in line with our zero-landfill policy.'

LIDL

'We are working on our strategy to allow flexible plastics to be recycled at all of our supermarket stores including the Godalming and the Farnham stores.' **SAINSBURY'S**

BOOTS

say their long-term company goal is to halve the environmental impact of Boots own brand products by **2030** and allow the return of hard-to-recycle health, beauty and wellness packaging such as lipsticks, mascaras and toothpaste tubes at stores in Farnham, Godalming, and Haslemere.

SOUTHERN CO-OP

said that all their store waste is diverted from landfill and all Co-op branded food packaging is now easy to recycle. Stores in the constituency also have soft plastic recycling bins.

DUNSFOLD GAS EXPLORATION UPDATE

In May, Jeremy met with members of Protect Dunsfold to discuss concerns around the AONB extension and Dunsfold's inclusion ahead of the court case in June - at the time of going to print we await the results of this latest legal challenge.

ROADS: SPEEDING/ POTHoles/ THAT ROAD CLOSURE!

Dozens of constituents have been in contact with concerns over the condition of some of our roads. In the Spring Budget Jeremy announced £200m to fix potholes, of which £3.7m was allocated to Surrey County Council. Got a bad pothole near you? Email Jeremy so he can get it put on the list.

FARNHAM INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRESS

The plans to transform the centre of Farnham continue at pace following Jeremy's decade long campaign for a less polluted and more pedestrian-friendly town centre.

Two significant steps include the banning of HGV's from the Town Centre and the introduction of 20mph zones in places to help calm traffic.

SCHOOLS

Jeremy meets regularly with a group of Head Teachers from Farnham schools. Partly as a result of these discussions, he found £2.3bn to add to the schools budget in last year's Autumn Statement.
